Teams: 3 or 4 riders and one Stable Manager (SM). *DCs/CAs must determine that members are safe to compete at chosen level, given the technical nature of show jumping courses.*

Divisions: Competitors may enter Qualifying or Non-Qualifying divisions based on the horse/rider ability and DC/CA approval.

Non-Qualifying

Non-qualifying divisions are open to D-2s and up on appropriate mounts. All non-qualifying level competitors will jump four numbered rounds. They will not have a jump-off or Take Your Own Line (TYOL) round.

NQ1 horse or pony 2'0" – 2'3"

NQ2* horse or pony up to 2'6"

NQ3 horse or large pony** 2'6" – 2'9"

* will jump the Introductory level course. One two stride combination, no jump off or TYOL.

** a large pony is over 13.2 hands but not larger than 14.2 hands.

Qualifying

Competitors attempting to qualify for Championships must meet the following age and certification requirements:

Modified Introductory	10 years or older	D-2 Trad/HSE and up
Standard Introductory	12 years or older	C-1 Trad/HSE and up
Modified Developing Horse/Rider	10 years or older	D-2 Trad/HSE and up
Standard Developing Horse/Rider	12 years or older	C-1 Trad/HSE and up
Standard Advanced	12 years or older	C-1 Trad/HSE and up
Stable Manager	12 years or older	D-3 H-M and up

Large ponies ridden by B- or A-certified members may compete at Horse II level, but must be able to handle distances specified for horses. In addition, members attempting to qualify in DHR, Modified (Horse I, Large Pony), or Regular (Horse II-IV) must complete a TYOL course as their fourth round; however, TYOL will not be scored or considered a qualifying round.

Qualifying Levels Offered:

Developing Horse/Rider	2'9" – 3'0"	3'0"
<i>Advanced - Standard Division only (No Modified):</i>		
Horse I/Large Pony	3'0" – 3'3"	3'6"
Horse II	3'3" – 3'6"	3'9"
Horse III	3'6" – 3'9"	4'0"
Horse IV	3'9" – 4'0"	4'3"

VRPC ranking criteria for Championships selection are based on the competitor's scores in rounds 1-3 (jump off score not included) and their Horse Management score. TYOL (round 4) will not be scored or included in Championships selection. TYOL is offered to provide an opportunity for competitors to plan and ride a TYOL round, which is included at Championships. In the last qualifying round, the Introductory Division will include a two stride combination of two verticals which will be included at Championships.

Fees:

Entry fee \$150 per VRPC competitor; \$150 per out-of-region competitor.
No straw bedding allowed, shavings only (not provided). No fee for Stable Managers.
Out of region competitors use code OutofRegion when registering online.

Payment:

Check with your club or center regarding payment policies—do they pay for your entry?

If yes, then do not pay online or send check. Let the Club or Center handle payment.

If you are paying for yourself, we prefer that you pay online if at all possible. If you must pay via check, mail check payable to VRPC and invoice to VRPC Treasurer, Steve Vorpahl, at 7482 Argyll Court Warrenton VA 20187

Important Notes Regarding Invoices and Payments:

- Invoices and payment receipts are generated by the system and emailed to the member during the registration process.
- **Entries must be paid by June 4th or 20% late fee will be added.**

Entry/ Registration: Registration to be done online at <https://virginiaregionponyclubs.wildapricot.org/calendar>. VRPC competitors, log into VRPC website using competitor's email. Use code OutofRegion for out-of-region competitors. Please note there is a separate link in the calendar for Individual competitor vs. Stable Manager entries. Please select appropriate link.

1. Current negative Coggins for each mount (name must match entered mount)
2. Signed Chaperone Form(s) to be uploaded during Team/Scrambler registration (in Forms section of VRPC website)
3. USPC Coaching Guidelines and Form, signed by coaches uploaded during Team/Scrambler registration (in Forms section of VRPC website)

Volunteers: Minimum of three volunteers per team entry is required. One volunteer will serve as Chaperone, in addition to their other volunteer responsibilities. One volunteer per team must be designated as Horse Management. Minimum of one volunteer per scramble entry is required for this Rally

Food: Available nearby; none on grounds.

General:

- Competitors may arrive on Friday, between 4:00 and 7:00 pm, but arrive no later than 7:00 pm. Friday arrivals must be arranged with the rally secretary. Only stalls may be set up. Equipment may be unloaded, but no tack rooms may be set up on Friday.
- Stalls must be stripped before departure.
- Competitors are required to wear their completed USPC/USEA Medical Card in their medical armbands or an approved medical bracelet for the duration of the rally.
- Barn appropriate footwear is required at all times.
- Only the team captain or appointed designee may pick up registration packets.
- Chaperones must be available on-site for the duration of the rally.
