Qualifying Competitors: (you can qualify and not attend champs):

Championship Division (Must be 12 years old by 1/1/19, Riding Rating - C1):

<u>USEF 2019 Training Level Tests</u> — Training Level <u>Test 2</u> and <u>Test 3</u> and competitors attempting to qualify for Championships must ride a training level musical, either individual kur or a pas de deux.

<u>USEF 2019 First Level Tests</u> — First Level <u>Test 2</u> and <u>Test 3</u> and competitors attempting to qualify for Championships must ride a First Level musical, either individual kur or a pas de deux.

<u>USEF 2019 Second Level Tests</u> — Second Level <u>Test 2</u> and <u>Test 3</u> and competitors attempting to qualify for Championships must ride a Second Level musical, either individual kur or a pas de deux.

<u>USEF 2019 Third Level Tests</u> — Third Level <u>Test 2</u> and <u>Test 3</u> and competitors attempting to qualify for Championships must ride a Third Level musical, either individual kur or a pas de deux.

<u>USEF 2019 Fourth Level Tests</u> — Fourth Level <u>Test 2</u> and <u>Test 3</u> and competitors attempting to qualify for Championships must ride a Fourth Level <u>Test 2</u> and <u>Test 3</u> and competitors attempting to qualify for Championships must ride a Fourth Level musical, either individual kur or a pas de deux.

Modified Division (Must be 10 years old by 1/1/19, Riding Rating – D2)

(This division does NOT perform a musical):

<u>USEF 2019 Training Level Tests</u> – Training Level <u>Test 1</u> and <u>Test 2</u>

USEF 2019 First Level Tests — First Level Test 1 and Test 2

USEF 2019 Second Level Tests - Second Level Test 1 and Test 2

<u>USEF 2019 Third Level Tests</u> – Third Level <u>Test 1</u> and <u>Test 2</u>

<u>USEF 2019 Fourth Level Tests</u> – Fourth Level <u>Test 1</u> and <u>Test 2</u>

Rings:

Introductory and Training Level tests are ridden in 20x40m arena. First Level & up tests, all individual musicals, pas de deux musicals, and quadrilles are ridden in 20x60m arena.

Water: There is no water available on site so please be sure to bring plenty of water for your horses, etc.

Rides:

- All Pony Club members MUST ride two tests. You will ride the lower test first and then the higher test. Scores from both tests will be included in final team placings.
- If wishing to qualify for USPC Championships in the Championship Division, the competitor MUST ride a musical freestyle, pas de deux, or quadrille at their chosen level; ride ALL tests at one level at Training Level or above; and you may NOT ride USDF Introductory Tests.
- Pony Club members MAY also ride an individual musical freestyle and/or a pas de deux or quadrille.

- The qualifying criteria for Championships team selection are based on the competitor's two test scores, formal inspection score, turn-back score and all individual horse management penalties.
 Musical ride scores are not included in these criteria. For the Championships Division a competitor must earn a 60% or higher score on Test 3 of their competition level at the qualifying rally. Those qualifying for the modified division must earn a 55% or higher on Test 2 of their competition level at the qualifying rally.
- Costumes are optional for all musical rides. However, riders must declare their intent to compete in costume. Leg wraps are allowed for those riding in costume with inspection at the Safety Check. Costumes are allowed for all Musical Rides at Championships.
- Leg wraps are also permitted for non-costumed pas de deux and quadrille freestyles with inspection at the Safety Check.
- Only D-1s and D-2s may have dressage tests read. Please indicate on entry form if this is required and provide name of reader. Leadline dressage for the USDF Intro tests will also be available.

Fees:

Entry fee \$65 per VRPC rider, \$90 for out of region rider. This will operate as a one-day rally and each team should have one trailer designated as their tack room. No fee for stable managers. Out-of-Region competitors' fee is \$107 per rider and on a space-available basis.

Volunteers:

Minimum of three volunteers in addition to one chaperone per team entry is required.

One volunteer per team must be designated as horse management.

Minimum of one volunteer for scramble entries is required.
